# GARDENING TIDBITS

If ever you are glad to be gardening in the Pacific Northwest, it is during the month of July. The average high is 76 degrees and the average low 57 degrees. These temperatures make the Pacific Northwest one of the most moderate climates in the United States.

- 1. Continue to remove spent annual flowers (deadheading) to promote more blooming.
- 2. Be vigilant about removing weeds or the weeds will soon overtake your garden beds. Weeds flourish in the July heat.
- 3. Continue to remove suckers from indeterminate tomato plants and support plants either with stakes or tomato cages.
- 4. Be on guard for Infestations of insects including but not limited to thrips (tiny winged insects about one-sixteenth of an inch), tomato fruit worm, squash vine borer, tomato hornworm, spider mites, chinch bugs, scale, snails, and slugs.
- 5. Monitor plants for diseases such as septoria leaf spot (fungal disease), powdery mildew, and rust. This fungus can destroy your plants.
- 6. (Mid-July) Pinch chrysanthemums one last time. Pinching too late in the summer reduces the blooms that you are counting on for fall displays.

# AMERICAN FLAG CAPRESE SALAD

# (WITH BLUEBERRY-BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE)

### INGREDIENTS

pound Cherry Tomatoes
8 oz packages Mini Mozzarella balls
pint fresh Blueberries
oz Fresh Mozzarella Cheese
cup Extra-Virgin Olive Oil
tablespoons White Balsamic Vinegar
tablespoon Honey
tablespoon Fresh Shallot (minced)
teaspoon Ground Pepper
add Fresh Basil Leaves (for garnish)



#### DIRECTIONS

- 1. Trim the stem end off each tomato, so they sit flat on their cut sides. Discard the ends or save for another use.
- 2. Begin assembling an American flag by arranging one row of 10 tomatoes, cut-side down, on a large platter or cutting board.
- 3. Arrange a row of 10 mozzarella balls directly below the tomatoes, and repeat with another row of tomatoes, another row of mozzarella balls, and another row of tomatoes.
- 4. On the third row of mozzarella balls, add 5 more to extend the row to the left. Repeat with tomatoes and mozzarella balls two more times, ending with tomatoes.
- 5. Set aside 1/4 cup blueberries. Arrange the remaining blueberries in a square to the right of the shorter rows of tomatoes and mozzarella balls.
- 6. Slice mozzarella into 4 pieces then cut each piece into quarters.
- 7. Using a paring knife, cut a star from each quarter, creating 16 stars total. (Alternatively, use a small star cookie cutter.)
- 8. Gently arrange the mozzarella stars on top of the blueberries.
- 9. Combine the reserved 1/4 cup blueberries, oil, vinegar, honey, shallot, salt and pepper in a blender; blend until smooth.
- 10. Scatter basil leaves around the flag, if desired, and serve with the dressing on the side.
