HERB TIPS

Herbs, both annual and perennial, grace my garden where their different scents perfume the air. If you like to cook or grill, fresh herbs are a must and so much less expensive than buying them in the grocery store. They are best planted in the spring although fall planting works as well. I recommend spring planting when you can find seedlings in garden centers, like Yard n Garden (NE 102nd St) or Cascade Greenhouse (NE 139th St) or any of the big box stores like Home Depot. Fall is a good time to transplant or divide perennials such as oregano, marjoram, thyme, rosemary, sage, lavender and mint or lemon balm. However, I suggest putting mint and lemon balm in pots; otherwise they spread everywhere. I keep some annual herbs such as basil, parsley and cilantro in pots close to the covered patio since it is closer to the kitchen and I use them a lot in my cooking. You can also pick herbs and add them to your flower arrangements as well. I also must confess that I grow catnip (in pots) for my two cats: Bella and Snowball.

I happen to like Middle Eastern food and tabbouleh is a delightful blend of cooked bulgar, couscous or quinoa, lots of finely chopped parsley, mint, tomatoes, cucumber (Persian or regular cucumbers that have been seeded) and finely chopped scallions; a well seasoned vinaigrette made with olive oil, minced garlic and lemon juice completes the dish. Serve with wedges of toasted pita bread or small tender leaves of romaine for a lovely appetizer.

Ways I use herbs

- Basil in making pesto
- Basil and oregano in Italian and Greek dishes
- Marjoram and thyme in French cooking
- Cilantro in Mexican and TexMex food
- Parsley in both American and European cuisine (I prefer flat leaf over curly)
- Lemon balm when steeped in boiling water makes a lovely tea

MONTHLY TASTY TIDBIT

SIMPLE TACO SOUP

INGREDIENTS

2 pounds ground beef or impossible burger

1 envelope taco seasoning

1-1/2 cups water

1 can (16 ounces) mild chili beans, undrained

1 can (15-1/4 ounces) whole kernel corn, drained

1 can (15 ounces) pinto beans, rinsed and drained

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) stewed tomatoes

1 can (10 ounces) diced tomato with green chilies

1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chilies, optional

1 envelope ranch salad dressing mix

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a large Sauce pan, cook beef (impossible burger) over medium heat until no longer pink.
- 2. Break the meat (impossible burger) into crumbles and drain excess juices.
- 3. Add taco seasoning and mix well.
- 4. Stir in the remaining ingredients.
- 5. Bring to a boil.
- 6. Reduce heat and simmer, uncovered, for 15 minutes or until heated through, stirring occasionally.


