# AMBERGLEN YARD OF THE SEASON

The goal of the *Yard of the Season* award program is to recognize individuals whose property exemplifies the vision of our Amberglen Community – beautiful and diverse. The Yard of the Season begins March 1st and continues through January with 1 winner each season. The yard chosen each season will be awarded the sign to display in front of their home for the duration of the season or until the next winner is announced. The winning yard will have its picture taken to be displayed on the AGW website and in the newsletter. The winner will also receive a plaque announcing the winning yard, season and year won, and a \$25 gift card to Yard 'N Garden Land, Home Depot, or Lowes (winner to choose).

#### GUIDELINES:

- 1. The AGW will select one Yard of the Season per the timelines listed below. Judging to begin the first week of each season.
  - Spring: March through May
  - \* Halloween: October through November
- Summer: June through September
- Christmas: December to January
- Amberglen Featured Yard

- 2. AGW Judges are not eligible to win.
- 3. The Yard of the Season sign will be placed in the winning yard in a spot agreeable to the property owner, by the AGW within the first week of announcing the next winner.
- 4. The Yard of the Season sign will be removed by the AGW on the 1st day following the announcement of the next winner (or sooner if the property owner desires).
- 5. The Yard of the Season sign will be removed no later than the second week of January (for the Christmas season winner) for maintenance and preparation for Spring.
- 6. The winning resident must be in good standing with Association dues.

#### LAWN CRITERIA:

- Healthy grass, no bare spots or excessive weeds
- Grass around foundations and fences shall be trimmed.
- Grass shall be mowed and edged
- Debris shall be picked up and removed (garbage, newspapers, pet waste, etc.)

#### LANDSCAPE AND FLOWER BED CRITERIA:

- Beds weeded and edged
- Trees and shrubs pruned
- Addition of new flowers, new trees, new shrubs, etc. (bonus)
- Flowers deadheaded and dead plants removed
- Natural areas clean
- Plantings in scale with the surroundings and limited to a few different types

#### WALKWAYS AND DRIVEWAY CRITERIA:

- Clean and stain free, no dirt or debris on curb
- Trash containers and yard products removed from view

#### AESTHETICS:

- Overall look of landscape is pleasing (formal or informal)
- Inviting look of front entryway (hanging baskets, pots, cleanliness, etc.)
- Originality/creativity (any special touches by owner such as yard art, bird feeders, etc.)

#### OTHER COMPONENTS:

Buildings, fences, porches, and patios on the property are required to be in good repair (minimal distraction from the landscape due to deterioration, damage or construction.

Note: The criteria listed above is consistent with HOA requirements.

# AUGUST TASTY TIDBITS

#### CROCK POT FRENCH DIP

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 pounds Whole Beef Chuck Roast
- ½ tablespoon Black Pepper
- 1 ½ teaspoons Salt
- 2 teaspoons Oregano
- 3 tablespoons Olive Oil
- 2 Small Yellow Onions (chopped)
- 4 cloves Garlic (minced)

- 2 sprigs Thyme
- 1 cup Low Sodium Beef Broth
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce
- 1 tablespoon Low Sodium Soy Sauce
- 1 cup Beer
- 8 Provolone Cheese (sliced)
- 8 Hoagie Rolls



#### **DIRECTIONS**

- Chop and peel onions and mince the garlic cloves.
- Season beef with salt, pepper, and oregano.
- Warm oil over medium high heat in a large skillet. Sear seasoned beef on both sides until a beautiful brown sear color occurs (about 3-4 minutes per side). Remove beef and set aside.
- In the same pan, add onions and sauté until softened, about 3 minutes. Add in garlic, and cook an additional 30 seconds. Place thyme sprigs on top
- Place onions and beef into a slow cooker. Add the beef broth, Worcestershire sauce, soy sauce and beer Place the lid on and cook on high for 3-4 hours or low for 6-8 hours.
- Once beef is cooked, remove beef and set to the side. Drain sauce over a colander into a large bowl. The juice left over is the au jus that can be thickened
- Shred beef and return to the slow cooker with some of the au jus to keep moist.
- To assemble sandwiches, place cheese into the inside of a hoagie roll and toast in the oven over 450 degrees for a few minutes, or until cheese melts. Top submarine rolls with shredded beef. Serve with au jus to dip into.

#### PEACHES AND CREAM PIE

## INGREDIENTS

#### CRUST:

- ¾ cup all-purpose flour
- 1 (3 ounce) package cook-and-serve vanilla pudding (not instant)
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup milk
- 3 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 large egg

#### FILLING:

- 1 (29 ounce) can sliced peaches in heavy syrup
- 1 tablespoon white sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup white sugar

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease the sides and bottom of a 10-inch deep-dish pie pan.
- 2. Make the crust: Whisk flour, pudding mix, baking powder, and salt together in a bowl. Add milk, butter, and egg; beat with an electric mixer for 2 minutes. Pour into the prepared pie pan.
- 3. Make the filling: Drain peaches, reserving 3 tablespoons syrup. Mix 1 tablespoon sugar and cinnamon together in a small bowl.
- 4. Beat cream cheese in another small bowl until fluffy. Add 1/2 cup sugar and reserved syrup; beat for 2 minutes.
- 5. Arrange sliced peaches over crust mixture. Spoon cream cheese mixture over peaches to within 1 inch of the pan edge, then sprinkle cinnamon sugar over top.
- 6. Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown, 30 -35 minutes. Cool for 20 minutes, then chill for 2 hours before serving.



# PALOUSE FALLS



Palouse Falls, formerly known as Aput which means "Falling Water," was named by the Palouse Native Americans. This iconic waterfall is located in the Palouse Falls State Park and is definitely worth experiencing!

Prior to the great Ice Age floods from glacial Lake Missoula, the Palouse River followed the route of the Washtucna Coulee River westward from Washtucna to Connell and then south along the Esquatzel Coulee to the Pasco area. That is where it joined the Columbia River. During the Ice Age floods, the huge volumes of water entering the Palouse drainage were so large that east of Washtucna waters spilled southward over a divide into the Snake River. At the end of the last ice age, repeated glacial floods, known as the Missoula Floods, swept across eastern Washington carving out the unique scablands landscape. Scablands are flat, elevated land deeply scarred by channels of glacial or fluvioglacial origin with poor soil and little vegetation. However, the Palouse Indian tribe tells a different story about how Palouse Falls came to be.

According to the Indian legend of the Pacific Northwest, Palouse River once flowed smoothly into the Snake. But four giant brothers, in pursuit of a mythic creature called Big Beaver, speared the great creature five times. Each time Big Beaver was wounded, he gouged the canyon walls, causing the river to bend and change. The fifth time he was speared, he fought the brothers valiantly and tore out a huge canyon. The river tumbled over a cliff at this point to become Palouse Falls. The jagged canyon walls show the deep marks of Big Beaver's claws. That must have been one great battle!

No matter how this fall was formed, Palouse Falls is one of most magnificent and lasting remnants of the glacial flood path, which is thousands of years old. It is the only major waterfall left. On February 12, 2014 the Palouse Falls became Washington's official state waterfall. Standing at a height of 198 feet and surrounded by astonishing basalt cliffs, the powerful waterfall lies on the Palouse River flowing together with the Snake River.

Isn't it great that our state has such magnificent topography!
