

Amberglen Good Works Clark County Food Bank



With a stated mission of "Alleviating Hunger and its Root Causes in Clark County, Washington," Clark County Food Bank manages over 8 million pounds of food each year—equivalent to 6.7 million meals for individuals and families in need. They work with 53 nonprofit partner agencies at 130 distribution sites to serve neighbors facing food insecurity throughout Clark County.

To successfully pursue their mission, CCFB partners with other nonprofits, private and corporate partners, and various other community organizations in the greater Clark County area. Their direct line of food distribution goes through over 50 partner agencies that provide a wide range of services to diverse clientele. The network of Partner Agencies includes food pantries, meal sites, shelters, community centers, churches, nonprofit organizations, and more.

With over 126,000 neighbors facing hunger in our community, the need is great. You can help by participating in AGW's Quarterly Food Donations program. Here's how it works: Once every quarter—on the third Saturday of March, June, September, and December—AGW volunteers will walk through the neighborhood and collect food donation bags. All you have to do is fill the bag with as much food as you can afford to give, then place the bag at your front door before 10am. We'll collect the food, return the bag to your front door, then deliver the food to Clark County Food Bank. Please keep the bag for the next donation date. If your bag gets lost, just contact Amberglen Good Works and we'll deliver a new one. And if you'd like to make a cash donation, please make out a check to Clark County Food Bank, put the check in an envelope and place the envelope in the bag.
